Old Business

Update on the 25th Anniversary. Larry spoke with Steve prior to the meeting regarding parking of The cars and news coverage. He also spoke with Joe Barone who met up with a news reporter who is willing to provide us with coverage for the car how. Joe and Steve will coordinate this. Steve will go to Tri-Boro this Sunday to go over details with the owner. Anyone wishing to join him can meet at his house or follow him. They want to park a few cars to make sure enough space is allowed for each car. They also want to figure out where the registration table will be set up, where the cars of the original 7 members will be parked and other details for that day. New Business
