Webmaster Report:

Debby reported that the minutes are on the website. The member list is up to date. Debby reviewed the upcoming events highlighting our 25th Anniversary event July 11th and the events in August. We have several events coming up in the next couple of weeks. Larry has been in communication with Trey Barone. He has a sample web site already established. He will send Larry the log-in information so he can take a look at it and make some tweaks if necessary. They will run side by side for now. We are basically ready to go. Larry will give it a final once over. He said it should be ready within a month.

We are required to file an annual report with the PA Department of State. Larry did it last year and again this year. This has already been completed and we are in compliance.

A new initiative we started is a Best of Cruise Metal Plaque which the Fire House is producing. They send an anonymous member of the Fire Company out among the cars to secretly select the winner. Then the winner is awarded the nice metal dash plaque at the cruise. It was done for the last two car shows and was really great. One of our newest members, Walt Simmons won at the June car show for his 1937 Red Chevy. This is good for the Club and it keeps the fire house engaged. It has been well received so far.

Update on the 25th Anniversary Car Show

Larry announced that he checked 3 different sources for weather and so as of now it looks good. Unless something dramatic comes up and we know it will ruin the event, it's a go. Everyone needs to pray for good weather.

Steve took the lead with the press coverage. Joe Barone had some trouble with his guy because that reporter is now retired. The Times News will be there at our Anniversary show and WFMZ was also contacted again and Larry contacted WNEP verbally and through email. Larry thinks that we will get some good news coverage.

Steve and Larry went down to Tri-Boro on Sunday and walked the grounds and measured

everything and even sampled some food. There are 160 spots on the macadam already marked. If we use the outer areas we have 210 spots safely and even 220 if necessary. Larry feels we have it all covered.

Steve is going down on Friday to paint the vendor spots and put all the signs out for the Show. Larry asked for volunteers to go down on Friday to help out. Dave Curran will bring his big canopy. The DJ's will be in the pavilion toward the edge. The lemonade truck and the ice cream truck can pull right in and not have to disconnect anything.

In case anyone wants to participate in the door prizes and does not bring a car, they can but they will have to pay the \$20 registration fee. Larry email blasted the menu to all members and said that there is also a full-service restaurant upstairs with good food.

Harry Lewis and Larry spoke last week about making a donation to Bill and Donna Gentile for their services to the Club. Our 25th Anniversary event and the Mahoning Nursing Home will be their last 2 shows since they are retiring from the DJ scene. A motion to donate \$500 for the two shows was made by Joe Boyle and seconded by Sal Lopresti, all were in favor, motion carried. It will be presented to them at the Mahoning Car Show.

Dave is working on the dash plaques. All the proofs are already in to him.

Reserved parking spaces are marked for the founding members and the past Presidents and our current President.

There is a table reserved for the door prizes. The tickets will be picked and assigned to each one of the prizes. The winning ticket holder will match their ticket to the one on the prize. They will have a young kid pick the winning tickets.

Joe Boyle will take care of all of the memorabilia. It will be set up in the lower level.

Pat will set up a thumb drive with pictures of the member cars to have something along with the memorabilia.

One of the vendors that is coming asked if she could make up coasters commemorating the Club's 25th Anniversary. Steve brought a sample to show us. Everyone liked it so he will tell her to go ahead and make them. She will make 20 of them and sell them for \$5. Steve will tell her to make 50.

One of the new members still owes \$10 for dues. It was decided that we would vote him in as a new member and are confident that we will collect the balance soon. As a matter of procedure, he will not get his membership card until dues are fully paid.

Joe Curran announced that we got \$100 for Club participation at the Palmerton Car Show. Joe will give the check to Judy

JoAnn sent an email to all members that have not paid their dues yet. Two more Members also recently paid. JoAnn will give Larry a list of the delinquent members with phone numbers for him to call. We have not imposed a late fee as of yet even though we voted to do that. We have been lenient so far.

Judy had a large sample presentation check made up to present to the Germantown Sportsman

Club on the day the Anniversary show. We will use this for photos at the show.

We got a thank you letter from St Joseph's Center for the donation we gave them.

No new members this month.

Dave brought up the fact that a lot of people leave these car shows early and suggested that we move up the trophy presentations and some of the other presentations. There was much discussion on the time changes. It was decided that instead of reprinting the agendas to hand out, announcements will be made to make any adjustments to the times and we will internally move things up.

There is definitely no Blockers show this year.
